Mule Deer Policy-P-28

**Part 3.** Historical "high" numbers are difficult to place in absolute terms and there is no definition of historic "high." The Lincoln CAB does not agree with placing absolute policy, such as season closures, with reference to historical numbers that are not clearly defined and do not necessarily represent sustainable populations.

Survey data should be incorporated as much as possible. Consistent and appropriate Buck-Doe Ratios and more importantly, consistent and appropriate fawn recruitment should be inclusive within the standard policy. Historical data should also be incorporated as much as possible.

**Part 12.** The Lincoln CAB does not agree with simply limiting hunting days to 60. Different areas within the state experience different dynamics and variables are numerous. There are too many factors that contribute to overall population increase/decrease to simply limit days of hunter pressure. Biological data and input will determine reductions and increases in populations. See Comment for part 3.

**Policy should include the following:**

-Reference to landscape-scale habitat restoration projects with an emphasis on the Nevada Partners in Conservation and Development.

-Emphasis on survey and data gathering. Consistency and Quality should be top priority. Biologists need to have the tools necessary to gather accurate data and information. Funds should be allocated and available for surveys to be implemented with minimal bureaucratic barriers.
