Subject: Restoring Mule Deer Populations

Members of Wildlife Commission,

We noted the current limiting factors to deer and their future expansion as follows:

- 1) Wildfires- loss of 1,000,000 acres to burns
- 2) Habitat- Old age growth and lack of recruitment
- 3) Grazing- hot season overgrazing/ Juniper encroachment
- 4) Urbanization
- 5) Drought and riparian issues

Suggestions were made to review working on projects encompassing habitat restoration and riparian issues. Our CAB will initiate a work shop/ meeting with invitations being forwarded to MDF, NDOW, BLM and the public for input on our proposals and to gather information from these named organizations for what projects are currently being done and what projects are currently being proposed. At this time we are channeling our efforts to create habitat and review working to protect water sources by fencing, channeling and concentrating water sources. We will formulate our plan and hopefully be able to fund some of these projects through Heritage Project funding. Also, funding should be available through other programs for those projects that are worked in conjunction with private landowners.

Our tentative schedule is to hold our first meeting in mid October to narrow down the projects to a workable number and then start the paperwork in conjunction with our November meeting.
