MARILYN'S POND

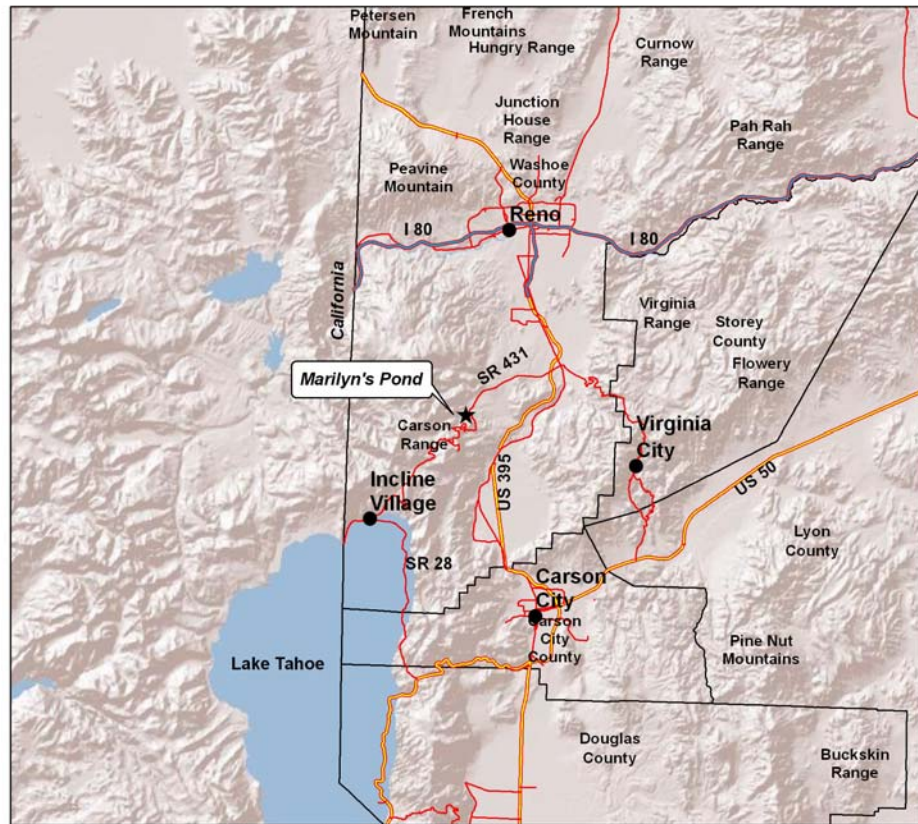
History – Marilyn's Pond was opened in 2003 when the existing pond was enlarged and improved. Marilyn's Pond is located on Girl Scout property just uphill from Galena Park.

Pertinent Information – The one acre pond is approximately 10 feet deep. This is a great pond to introduce youngsters to fishing, the shoreline provides easy access to the water and kids are almost certain to catch a small rainbow trout and maybe even a brookie. There is a handicap accessible pier with a fishing dock. The normal assortment of bait, lures, and flies work well on the hatchery stocked fish. Bait includes Power Bait, corn and nightcrawlers. Lures include Mepps, Rooster Tails, Panther Martin, Kastmaster, Vibrax and Daredevil Midgets. Flies include pheasant tail, hare's ear, prince nymphs and Sheep Creek specials. The park is open during normal park hours.

Stocking – Marilyn's Pond is scheduled to receive 3,000 catchable rainbow trout this spring and 1,000 catchable rainbow trout this fall.

Regulations – Open year around, during public park hours. Limit is 5 gamefish, of which not more than 2 may be black bass.

Biologist Forecast for 2009 – Fishing should be great following stocking. The pond silted in 2006 following a flood event and was dredged out later that summer.

Access – Turn right into Galena Park, which is located just after crossing Galena Creek on the Mt. Rose Highway at the base of the summit. Proceed several hundred yards to the parking lot, then walk several hundred feet to the pond.
