Suzanne,

The following are the Actions and Recommendations taken at the February 1, 2010 meeting of the Carson City Advisory Board to Manage Wildlife:

1. The Carson CAB voted to establish a joint Sub-Committee with the Douglas County CAB to make recommendations on ways to improve the deer herd restoration efforts in Nevada. The Washoe County and Storey County CABs will be invited to join to form the Sierra Front Deer Herd Restoration Sub-Committee.
2. The motion to support the proposed language to increase the percentage of the Heritage Fund made available for projects each year failed for lack of a supporting motion.
3. The Carson CAB voted to support the proposed letter requesting that the "use" of the Wine-Cup Ranch not be changed.
4. The Carson CAB supports General Regulation 374 LCB File No. R114-09, Use of an arrow with an illuminated nock and its other provisions.
5. The Carson CAB supports regulation 374 LCB File R114-09 regarding the use of a reasonable effort but request that the term "reasonable" be better defined.
6. The Carson CAB supports the regulation 374- LCB File No. R138-09 authorizing the Department to issue a scope permit to persons with a visual disability.
7. The Carson CAB supports the action regarding the Heritage Committee and the action for harvest controls.
8. The Carson CAB opposes the action to use more than 75% of Heritage Funds. The Carson CAB feels that this is the wrong time to bring attention to the Heritage Fund at all.
9. The Carson CAB supports the Commission Regulation 10-01, 2011 Heritage Tag Quota and Seasons.
10. The Carson CAB Does Not support the Commission Regulation 09-05, Amendment #1 as submitted. The Carson CAB feels that the duration of the season should be Nov.20 - Dec. 20 for BOTH Resident and NON-Resident hunters.
