Mule Deer Protection Project

Description of project (Include site plan if applicable): This project is intended to reduce predator densities in local areas in an effort to protect mule deer in several specific geographic locations in northwestern Nevada. The locations of emphasis include; hunt unit 014 (Granite Range), unit 015, unit 035 (Jackson Mountains), and 031 ( Bilk Creek Range). Predators targeted for removal will be primarily mountain lions and coyotes. Time and location of removal activities will ultimately be determined by NDOW and largely based on written recommendations from Wildlife Services. Wildlife Services' written recommendations will be a byproduct of their predator density surveys, analyses, and summarizations. After first evaluating mule deer herd status to identify populations potentially needing protection, the criteria for treatment areas should be as follows: 1) Low observed fawn ratio in fall survey. 2) Emphasis should be placed on non-migratory resident type herds. 3) Areas should be accessible by sportsmen (limited access areas are lower priority). 4) Enhancement area should be primarily for mule deer. 5) Projects must be geared for success. 6) A pre-survey of predator type and density should be performed. 7) No more than 15-20% should be used for monitoring pre and post treatment areas.
