DEFINITIONS

TRAP LINE: A series of traps put into one geographical area and generally checked in the course of a day. It may vary from a few sets to 100 or more. Two trap lines can be checked concurrently, that is a 1st trap line checked on Sundays and Wednesdays and a 2nd trap line checked on Saturdays and Tuesdays. Or different trap lines can be run consecutively, i. e. one operated in Nov. and the second run in Dec/Jan.

TARGET SPECIES: All of the following species are furbearer species in Nevada:

Beaver, Bobcat, Fox (Gray, Kit, Red), Mink, Muskrat, Otter.

Additionally, these species are commonly harvested and should be reported in harvest:

Coyote, Raccoon, Ring-tailed Cat, Skunk (Spotted, Striped), weasel (ermine).

NON TARGET: Any mammals or birds not listed as a target species above.

NUMBER OF TRAPS IN TRAP LINE: Trappers add and remove traps frequently in the normal course of any trap line. Number of traps therefore is an average number of traps used on a certain trap line.

NUMBER OF DAYS RUN (duration): Number of days that trap line was operated.
