1. Roll Call

2. Pledge of Allegiance

3. For Possible Action: Approval of minutes

- Walt Mandeville motioned to approve the minutes of the April 29, 2019 meeting; Wes Clyde seconded and the motion passed unanimously 5-0.

5. Advisory Board Items for discussion (No action will be taken)

Joe mentioned that there is a lot of positive feedback on the trail cameras on eastern half of state. He has some trail cams in the pinenuts that have also had positive results. Jessie Weller asked how transient bears are and Joe responded that bears will stick around for pine nut crop. Jessie mentioned reading about a bear den ambush possibly in that area and stated that he felt that NDOI did a great job clarifying that the guys were not hunters and did not represent the hunting community.

6. For Possible Action: on any/all Nevada Wildlife Commission Agenda items for their meeting in June. (Action may be taken)

Sand Springs Navy Land Acquisition:

Rob discussed concerns about the agenda packet item regarding the Navy acquiring Sand Springs area. Joe Crawford mentioned that he has been in attendance to a couple wildlife meetings and the Navy will take away a couple hundred acres of hunting if this passes.

Rob Jacobson said that the locals use Sand Springs for chuckar hunting and he is not sure why the Navy can't fly planes over – take the air space but leave the ground. He would like to find out more about this. Jessie Weller added how Slate Mountain is off limits and how he does not want to lose public lands.

Rob stated that the most tags are in that unit. Joe added that there are lions, sheep and chuckars. Jessie Weller stated that he would like to hold on to public lands the best we can whether we hunt the land or not.

Rob Jacobson said that he will be at the Nevada Board of Wildlife Commissioners meeting in Hawthorne and would like to find out about access that is granted or taken away.

- Rob Jacobson made a motion that the CAB board opposes the acquisition and that it is still open to the public. Joe seconded and the motion passed unanimously 5-0.

Duck Stamp Request:

Jessie Weller discussed the duck stamp request projects for 2020 funding and stated that he is glad to see a couple of projects at Carson Lake. The dam is important and needs to be done.

- Jessie Weller made a motion to approve the Duck Stamp projects for 2020. Wes seconded and the motion passed unanimously 5-0.

Rob Jacobson mentioned the selling of a lot of Heritage Tags. Some in Salt Lake and another in Sacramento. He is curious as to how they pick and award that.
