

Minutes of the Meeting of the Mineral County Advisory Board to Manage Wildlife

Glenn Bunch called the meeting to order and noted that the meeting was properly noticed

Glenn requested we take the agenda out of order taking item 2 relative to the budgets before the Upland Game and Furbearer Season item. Board Concurred.

Fiscal Year 2018 County Advisory Board Budget Request.- The Board will review the Mineral County budget request submitted to the Commission as they may approve budgets for County Advisory Boards to Manage Wildlife for fiscal year 2018.

Glenn gave an update on the historical data of the county's expenses on the budget numbers. Discussion of PACT charges.

Glenn Bunch noted to the board that a request was submitted for \$5,111.49 but the department adjusted it to \$4,346.00 a difference of \$765.49

Glenn reported that we will probably run short based in historical data.

The \$1,906.69 cash balance does not include anticipated expenditures for attending the May meeting in Reno, the June meeting in Las Vegas, nor the Recording Secretary costs for each meeting.

Calculating expected cost for the June travel to Las Vegas, our ending fund balance should be approximately \$450 after paying for this meeting.

If we run short next year, we will have to go in for an augmentation to our budget to complete the travel for 2017-2018 year or just not go to the final meeting.

Commission Regulation CR 16-13, Amendment # 1 – Upland Game and Furbearer Season, Bag Limits and Special Regulations 2017- The Board will make recommendation to the Commission for them to consider amendments to this regulations for seasons, bag limits, and special regulations for upland game birds, rabbits, wild turkey, furbearers, and falconry seasons for 2017-2018

Open to hunters 17 years of age or younger only. Youth must be accompanied by an adult who is at least 18 years old.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS: Youth must be 12 prior to the opening of the hunt season indicated and not attain their 18th birthday until after the last day of the hunt season indicated.

Applications for these tags or bonus points will only be accepted during the draw application periods. Remaining tags will not be issued.
