

Minutes of the Meeting of the Mineral County Advisory Board to Manage Wildlife
Monday, October 29, 2018 at 6:00 PM

Glenn Bunch called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM and noted that the meeting was properly noticed on October 22, 2018

→**CGR 482. Public and Sellable Lists, LCB File No R 192-18, The board will consider recommendations to the Commission as they will hold a workshop to consider amending Chapter 488 and 502 of the Nevada Administrative Code (NAC). This regulation clarifies the authority of the Department to remove specific personal information from any list sold or distributed by the Department or the Department's licensing vendor and makes it confidential. The regulation also simplifies how a person can request that their personal information remain confidential by removing the requirement that the request be in writing. (Public Comment)**

Glenn gave an update to the board why this has been brought before the Commission. Glenn read to the Commission the proposed recommendation of the new language. It will have their address and phone number from the list.

Glenn stated that the WLWG paid for a list of the licensed fishing license holder. He also explained that he did not want his personal information passed on to anyone else. It was said that The hunters alert group likes to go and watch the tags being drawn and with it being done out of state that they were not able to watch the official draw. Glenn explained that there is nothing to see and further explained the process. That is why when you got your tags this year, you could go in and look but there was no other information of other hunters available to view, only your own personal information was all. Before you could see whether you were successful and the new procedure does not display the info. After explanation, the Board could see why it would be important to not have the personal information available to the public.

Billie Williams Jr moved and seconded by Johnny Peterson to support the Department with their recommendation to withhold information as designated by the applicant. Motion carried.

→**CGR 480, Shotgun Gauges Legal for Turkey Hunting, LCB File No. R 194-18 The Board will consider recommendation to the Commission as they will consider adopting a regulation relating to amending Chapter 503 of the Nevada Administrative Code (NAC). This regulation would remove the prohibition against using a shotgun smaller than 20 gauge to hunt wild turkey. It would also clean up unnecessary language regarding shot size used on a wildlife management area. The Commission held a workshop on September 21, 2018 and the Commission directed the Department to reverse the changes on page 1, keeping the prohibition against using a shotgun smaller than a 20 gauge and retaining the cleanup language on page 2 relating to shot size used on a wildlife management area. (Public Comment)**

Glenn gave an update of information that came out in the last meeting relative to the difference between a 410 gauge and a 20 gauge shell. When it finally came down the department

recommendation that nothing smaller than a 20 gauge shell and cleaned up the language. Even though it was explained about the new 410 shot. After further discussion relative to shot sizes the following motion was made:

Johnny Peterson moved, Billie Williams seconded that we agree with the Department as nothing smaller than a 20 gauge shell to be used on a turkey hunt. Motion carried.

→**Commission Regulation 19-02 Noncommercial Collection of Reptiles and Amphibians for 2019-2020** The board will consider recommendation to the Commission as they consider and may take action to approve 2019-2020 season limits for noncommercial hobby collecting of live, unprotected reptiles and amphibians. (Public Comment)

Glenn reported that if you go over the list and see the list of horned toads and lizards you could capture. When we grew up, nobody cared. But now, if you got kids they are out in the desert catching critters.

After further discussion, the board concurred with the department recommendation.

→**Information update from the September 21-22, 2018 NDOW meeting.** The Board will receive information provided to the public relative to the cost savings of the new License structure. This information was received at the 9/21-22 meeting and is being forwarded to the local board as an information item only. (Public Comment)

Glenn showed the board the powerpoint presentation that was given to the Commission by Deputy Director Jack Robb at the last Commission meeting in September. The Board appreciated seeing the savings that was recognized by the change in vendor and appreciated the work by the Department putting together the information for the public to see.

A Discussion was brought up by Johnny Peterson about the lettering disappearing off the new license and is there anything that can be done to print on better quality so it withstands the wear of being in ones wallet. Glenn stated that he would bring it up to the Department at the meeting this Friday.

→**Discussion of other items on the Commission Agenda for November 2-3, 2018 Meeting.** (Public Comment)

No other items were brought up for discussion.

→**Update, Discussion and planning details for the June 21-22, 2019 NV Board of Wildlife Commissioners Meeting to be held in Mineral County.** (Public Comment)

Glenn explained to the board that he had spoke with Glenn Cairns at the El Capitan and has reserved the upstairs room for the dates of the meeting. He informed the board that another group had tentatively penciled in and reserved the room last year when they were in town. But since they had not gotten back to the El Cap and firmed it up, he would reserve the room for the Wildlife Commission Meeting.

Darren Hamrey advised Glenn this morning that the Sportsman Club had discussed providing a dinner for the group for Friday Night. Details are not given yet, and Darren was not present to fill the board in with more details. It will continue on the next Board meeting before the January Commission Meeting.

Johnny Peterson said he spoke with the Colonel at the base and when it gets closer to the date let him know to work on plans on a tour of Mt. Grant for the Commission. He didn't say no. How far it goes will depend on how much snow may be on the mountain in June and how much time they have after the meeting. Further plans will continue at the next board meeting.
