FREE AIS REMOVAL

ATTENTION BOATERS and **WATER ENTHUSIASTS**: Lake Mead and the lower Colorado River system contain harmful quagga mussels. Do your part and help prevent the spread of Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS).

Get a **FREE** Watercraft Inspection and AIS Removal on your watercraft when **ENTERING** or **EXITING** Lake Mead National Recreation Area.

Lake Mead/Callville Bay
9 a.m. – 6 p.m. / Open 7 days

Lake Mohave/Cottonwood Cove
9 a.m. – 5 p.m. / Wednesday - Sunday

WINTER HOURS*: September 3 – April 30

Hemenway Harbor, Callville Bay & Cottonwood Cove
By appointment only: 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.

*Hours of operation may change due to weather and boater traffic conditions

CLEAN - Remove all mud, plants and animals from every part of your boat, trailer and equipment.

DRAIN - Before you leave the recreation area, eliminate all water from your boat, including its live-wells, ballast, hull and engine-cooling water.

DRY - Allow time for your boat to completely dry before you launch in any other waters.
