
Scuba Divers and Snorkelers Decontamination Guidance



You can prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species using this checklist every time you exit a waterbody:

Gear and Equipment Decontamination Guidance

✓ CLEAN

Inspect and clean off any visible plants, animals and mud from wetsuit, dry suit, mask, snorkel, fins, buoyancy compensator, regulator, cylinder, weight belt, boat, motor and trailer (if using) before leaving water access.

*Soak gear used in freshwater dives in 3.5% salt solution (1/2 cup salt per gallon of water).

*Rinse inside and outside of gear with hot water.

✓ DRAIN

Drain all water from all equipment including buoyancy compensator, regulator, cylinder boot, boat, motor (if using) and any water containing devices before leaving water access.

✓ DRY

Dry everything for a minimum of 7 days in the middle of summer.

Drying times during the winter can be longer.

Wipe all areas down with a towel before reuse.

Completely dry all equipment before storing or reusing.

Divers and snorkelers using watercraft should refer to the specific watercraft guidelines under motorized or non-motorized watercraft guidance.

What can you do to help prevent the spread or introduction of AIS?

- EVERYTIME & EVERYWHERE CLEAN, DRAIN AND DRY
- NEVER DUMP LIVE FISH OR OTHER ORGANISMS INTO A BODY OF WATER UNLESS IT CAME FROM THAT WATERBODY
- NEVER DUMP AQUARIUM PLANTS AND ANIMALS
