FREE AIS REMOVAL

ATTENTION BOATERS and WATER ENTHUSIASTS: Lake Mead and the lower Colorado River system contain harmful quagga mussels. Do your part and help prevent the spread of Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS).

Get a **FREE** Watercraft Inspection and AIS Removal on your watercraft when **ENTERING** or **EXITING** Lake Mead National Recreation Area.



DO YOUR PART

STOP AQUATIC HITCHHIKERS like quagga mussels from spreading to other waters by visiting our AIS Removal Stations and always remember to **Clean, Drain and Dry... Every Time and Everywhere.** (NRS 503.917)

It's a violation of Nevada State Law to transport aquatic invasive species. Violators can be subject to fines and penalties. Nevada State Law requires the removal of drain plugs during transport on public roads. (NAC 488.526/NRS 488.045)

By appointment only: 8 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

CLEAN - Remove all mud, plants and animals from every part of your boat, trailer and equipment.

DRAIN - Before you leave the recreation area, eliminate all water from your boat, including its live-wells, ballast, hull and engine-cooling water.

DRY - Allow time for your boat to completely dry before you launch in any other waters.
