# Proposed Regulation Prior to November Workshop

- Shall not place, maintain, or use a trail camera
  - In a way that prevents or alters wildlife access to water
  - Within 200 feet of a spring, water hole, or artificial water basin from August 1<sup>st</sup> to December 31<sup>st</sup>.
  - At any place (regardless of water) from August 1<sup>st</sup> to December 31<sup>st</sup> if the camera is capable of transmitting images or video

# Proposed Regulation After November Workshop

- Shall not place, maintain, or use a trail camera or similar device
  - In a way that prevents or alters wildlife access to water
  - Within 300 feet of a spring, water source, or artificial water basin at any time of year
  - Anywhere or any time if it's a transmitting camera
  - At any place (regardless of water) from August 1<sup>st</sup> to December 31<sup>st</sup>

# Exemptions

- Local, state, federal, or industry employees acting within the scope of their official duties and with cameras marked with ownership
- Any person who uses the camera in consultation with the Department
- Private property with permission of the landowner
- Cameras used to monitor livestock use of a water source to which the operator has a permitted stock water right with the State Engineer

# Boone & Crockett Essay on Fair Chase

9/5/2016

...when technology becomes a substitute for basic skills in the field (i.e., buying skill), this is where technology not only undermines the hunting experience, but also has the potential to erode public support for hunting. It is very difficult to maintain any credible claim that hunting is rewarding because of the challenge if the entire experience can come down to pressing a button on a highly sophisticated device.

...Advances in technology have made hunting very efficient for the hunter, more efficient than what some game populations can bear...

...Recognizing humans are the alpha predator and that there is a need to limit our hunting advantage over wildlife is key to using technology in an ethical manner. A fair chase hunter does not measure success by the sophistication of the technology they employ, but by the level of restraint they use.
