Forum restrictions and orderly business: The viewpoint of a speaker will not be restricted, but reasonable restrictions may be imposed upon the time, place and manner of speech.

Irrelevant and unduly repetitious statements and personal attacks that antagonize or incite others are examples of public comment that may be reasonably limited. Minutes of the meeting will be produced in summary format.

1. **Call to Order and Roll Call of Committee Members – Commission and Committee Chairman Johnston**
2. **Approval of Agenda – Commission and Committee Chairman Johnston – For Possible Action**  
The Committee will review the agenda and may take action to approve the agenda. The Committee may remove items from the agenda, continue items for consideration or take items out of order.
3. **Member Items – Announcements and Correspondence – Commission and Committee Chairman Johnston – Informational**  
Committee members may present emergent items. No action may be taken by the Committee. Any item requiring Committee action may be scheduled on a future Committee agenda. The Committee will review and may discuss correspondence sent or received by the Committee and may provide copies for the exhibit file (Committee members may provide hard copies of their correspondence for the written record). Correspondence sent or received by the Department will also be discussed.
4. **Landowner Deer and Antelope Compensation Tag Program Presentation – Supervising Game Biologists Tom Donham and Mike Scott – Informational**  
Department Staff assigned to the Committee will provide a PowerPoint presentation on the history of the Landowner Compensation Tag Program and answer questions from the Committee.
5. **Discussion of Landowner Deer and Antelope Compensation Tag Program – Commission and Committee Chairman Johnston – Informational**  
The Committee members will discuss the program and possible changes to improve the program for wildlife, landowners, sportsmen, and the Department. The Committee will also discuss issues related to the statutory cap on landowner compensation tags.

6. **Discussion of Topics Delegated to Landowner Tag Committee by TAAHC Committee – Commission and Committee Chairman Johnston:**

- Private land season: Consider reinstating private land season. Hunter could pick a 30 day period to hunt but would be restricted to the landowner's private land includes reinstating Nov 1 – Nov 30 season. *Note – 1. TAAHC did not support. 2. Have a Nov-Dec deer hunt within the unit/units. Sell tags to highest bidder-half of money to landowner half to mule deer rehabilitation fund.*
- Private land season: Suggest that hunters must hunt on the landowner's private land. Have landowners set the thirty day period with guidelines provided by NDOW. *Note - Tag only valid on private lands in conjunction with normal deer/antelope seasons.*
- Doe Hunt: Landowner to specify which property to hunt does. 1-2% doe harvest.
- Review Process: NDOW needs to really look at the process of how land owners get depredation tags for all species. *Note - NDOW needs to get better control of this process, and have more people involved in determining if a landowner is truly justified in getting a tag.*
- Landowner Program: Hunter must select weapon type to hunt with. *Note - Non-stratified seasons for Landowner Compensation Tags (just archery, muzzleloader or rifle) not all three. WPCAB and LCAB support this proposal.*

8. **Public Comment Period**

Persons wishing to speak may do so at this time. Public comment will be limited to three minutes. No action can be taken by the Committee at this time; any item requiring Committee action may be scheduled on a future Committee agenda.
