

Species: Antelope

Unit Group: 041,042

Access:

Units 041, 042 are located east of Highway 447 and the town of Gerlach and west of Interstate 80 and the town of Lovelock in Pershing and Humboldt Counties. Access is good to all units. Four-wheel drive vehicles are necessary.

Facilities and Services:

Hospitals and motels are in Fernley, Lovelock and Winnemucca. Restaurants, fuel and convenience stores are in Gerlach, Fernley, Lovelock, Rye Patch Reservoir exit (I-80), Mill City/Unionville exit (I-80) and Winnemucca.

Recommended Hunting Areas:

Antelope densities throughout the unit group are considered average to high. Generally, antelope will be found within a 2-mile perimeter surrounding a water source. Also, antelope can be found on the valley floors to the higher elevations of each mountain range.

Unit 041: Selenite Range (west and east sides), Nightingale Mountains (Sage Hen Spring, Stonehouse Canyon and Tunnel Springs), Sahwave Mountains (west and east sides, west portion of the Trinity Range (ragged top north to Eagle Pitcher Mine area, various big game guzzlers), Lava Beds (east side of the range), Seven Troughs Range (Porter Springs, Vernon, Burnt Canyon, Stonehouse Canyon, Rocky Canyon, Egbert Canyon, Cow Creek and Mule Canyon), Placerites and Rabbit Hole/Barrell Springs.

Unit 042: Northeast portion of the Trinity Range (Trinity Canyon, Blackrock Canyon, Sportsman's/Natchez Springs), Poker Brown Gap, west side Rye Patch Reservoir, Majuba Canyon, Imlay Summit Road, Antelope Summit Road, Kamma Mountains and Eugene Mountains.

Special Comments:

Camping on public lands administered by BLM is unrestricted. It is suggested to scout and familiarize yourself with roads and animal use areas before hunting.
