Access:

These units are located east of Interstate 80 within Pershing and Humboldt Counties. For unit descriptions see NDOW Big Game Hunting Guide. Access to antelope hunting is considered excellent. Four-wheel drive vehicles are necessary. Hiking is required to access upper elevations of each mountain range within each unit.

Facilities and Services:

Hospitals and motels are in Lovelock and Winnemucca. Restaurants, fuel and convenience stores are in Lovelock, Rye Patch Reservoir exit (I-80), Mill City/Unionville exit (I-80) and Winnemucca.

Recommended Hunting Areas:

Units with highest antelope densities are Unit 043 and 044. Generally, antelope will be found within a 2-mile perimeter surrounding a water source. Also, antelope can be found on the valley floors to the higher elevations of each mountain range.

Unit 043 Humboldt Range: Relief Canyon Mine area, Buffalo Spring, Limerick Canyon, Coyote Canyon north to Creek Hill.

Unit 044 East Range: Dun Glen area, Willow Creek Road, Spaulding Canyon, Table Mountain, along Grass Valley Road (Winnemucca south to end of unit), Goldbanks Hill and Rose Creek Mountain.

Unit 045 Tobin Range: along Grass Valley Road (Winnemucca south to end of unit), Pollard Canyon/Jim Creek, base of Golconda Canyon, Jersey Valley, base of Morning View Canyon north to Flag Canyon.

Unit 046 Sonoma Range: along Grass Valley Road (Winnemucca south to end of unit), Elbow Canyon, Grand Trunk Canyon, Sheep Ranch Canyon Road, Pumpnickel Valley, Smesler Pass/Summit Spring, Sonoma Lake area, Edna Mountains, Pole Creek, Krammer Hill and Button Point area.

Special Comments:

Camping is unrestricted. Units 043, 044 and 046 have fishable trout streams. It is suggested to scout and familiarize yourself with roads and animal use areas before hunting.
