- Nationwide population estimates*: 88,090
- Total removed: 11,472
- Total placed into private care: 4,609
- Total trained: 1,479
- Total fertility control treatments: 702
- Total expenditures: \$81.226 million

Wild Horse and Burro Update

- Adoption Incentive Program for Wild Horses and Burros - IM 2019-025
 - Offers financial incentive in the amount of \$500 within 60 days from the adoption date and an additional \$500 within 60 days from the title date, if completed within 60 days of title eligibility.
- Gathers Planned
 - Silver King - 980
 - Pine Nuts – 575
 - Seven Troughs – 200 burro's
 - Triple B – 750
 - Fish Creeks - 700

10 Years to AML Proposal

(Humane Society, ASPCA, Return to Freedom)

Proposal associated with upcoming BLM Report to Congress

4 Step Plan

1. Removals

- 3 to 5 year round-up plan to remove 50,000 horses

2. Fertility Control

- treat 90% of on-range mares in conjunction with removals

3. Less Expensive Holding Facilities

- American Mustang Foundation (AMF) provide off-range pasture for up to 50,000

4. Adoptions

- Increase adoptions by focusing on East Coast
