**Title:** Commission Regulation CR22-12

**Description:** The Commission will review and may take action to approve the Department's recommendations identified in CR22-12 Draft Review for upland game and furbearer seasons and limits for the 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 seasons.

Summary:

**CR22-12**

The Department's Game Division has prepared recommendations for Commission Regulation CR22-12 for upland game and furbearer seasons for the 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 seasons. Some notable changes compared to previous years include the following:

*Youth Seasons*

- Youth seasons will extend for
- 
- their normal 9-day period (e.g., October 1 – October 9<sup>th</sup>, 2022); however, we have elected to recommend a reduction in the Gambel's quail limit from a daily limit of 10 and possession limit of 30, down to 5 and 15 respectively. These limits are also reflected in the normal general season as well.
- Youth rabbit seasons will remain the same; however, the daily bag limit and possession limit are recommended for reduction from 10 and 30 to 5 and 15 respectively. This is due to the downward trend and low density of all species of rabbits.
- We are recommending closing all pygmy rabbit seasons.

#### *Sage-grouse*

- We are recommending a 9-day season in certain hunt units in Elko County (062, 064, 067, 071, 072, 073 and 074) with a daily limit of 2 and possession limit of 2.
- We are recommending a two-day season hunt units 161 and 162 in central Nevada, hunt units 012 and 013 in western Nevada and hunt units 031 and 051 in north central Nevada with a daily and possession limit of 2 sage-grouse.
  - These units, or groups of units, have sage-grouse populations estimated to exceed 1,000 birds and where harvest was estimated to be 5% or less of the estimated fall population.
- No special sage-grouse season is being recommended for the Sheldon National Wildlife Refuge.
- These recommended changes represent the closure of 18 hunt units compared to those that were open last season, including the Sheldon National Wildlife Refuge (hunt unit 033).

#### *Dusky, Sooty and Ruffed Grouse*

- No major changes

#### *Snowcock*

- No major changes

#### *Chukar and Hungarian Partridge*

- Recommend October 15, 2022 – February 5, 2023
- Recommend October 14, 2023 – February 4, 2024
- Daily limit of 6 with a possession limit of 18

#### *California Quail*

- No major changes

#### *Gambel's Quail*

- Recommend reducing the daily limit to 5 quail and possession limit to 15 for this species due to extensive drought conditions in the Mojave Desert ecoregion and low population numbers.

#### *Mountain Quail*

- No major changes

#### *Pheasant*

- No major changes

#### *White-tailed Jackrabbits and Cottontail Rabbits*

- Recommending a reduction in the daily and possession limits from 10 rabbit per day and 30 in possession down to 5 and 15 respectively due to declining trend in rabbit numbers and low densities observed during survey routes.
- Recommend closing all pygmy rabbit seasons due to amount of habitat loss over the past two decades, declining trends and densities observed during recent and ongoing research efforts being conducted by the University of Nevada, Reno and the confirmed presence of Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease Type 2.

#### *Junior Wild Turkey*

- Some modifications to tag numbers are being recommended.

- Recommending a new junior hunt opportunity for hunt unit 154 in Lander County.

#### *Wild Turkey Spring Limited Entry Hunt*

- Some modifications to tag numbers are being recommended.
- We are recommending closing the Lyon County Private Lands Spring Turkey hunt due to low turkey populations and turkeys being potentially baited onto private lands adjacent to the Mason Valley Wildlife Management Area during the spring season.

#### *Falconry Seasons*

- No changes

### **Furbearer Seasons**

#### *Bobcat*

- Recommending change to bobcat sealing dates. Change would allow an individual to have a single bobcat per year for taxidermy or tanning purposes to be sealed at any of the NDOW Regional Offices (Elko, Las Vegas and Reno). Dates open for regional office sealing are from the Season Opener until the first regularly scheduled sealing date (mid-January).

### **Recommendation:**

The Department recommends that the Commission **VOTE TO APPROVE THE RECOMMENDATIONS PROVIDED IN CR22-12 FOR THE 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 SEASONS AS PRESENTED.**

## **WILD TURKEY**

### **2023 & 2024 SPRING TURKEY APPLICATION PROCEDURES FOR RESIDENT AND NONRESIDENT HUNTS:**

Unless his or her privilege is limited or revoked pursuant to law, an eligible person may apply once for a type of hunt for Wild Turkey during a draw period.

Only one person may apply on an application.

Except for those Wild Turkey hunts requiring the landowner to sign the application, Wild Turkey applications must be submitted online through [www.ndowlicensing.com](http://www.ndowlicensing.com). Hand delivered applications will not be accepted. Applications will be accepted until 11:00:00 p.m. on the first Tuesday in February. Applications for bonus points only will be accepted until 11:00:00 p.m. on the second Tuesday in February. The release date will be the first Friday in March.

*Except as specified for the Junior Wild Turkey Hunts and Landowner Hunts*, any remaining tags will be available on a first come, first serve basis through [www.ndowlicensing.com](http://www.ndowlicensing.com). Remaining tags will be sold until seven (7) weekdays prior to the close of the season.
