**1) Commission General Regulation 500, Subdivision Map Review.**

**In a unanimous vote (5-0) vote, the Clark CABMW had the following comments on Draft Commission General Regulation 500, Subdivision Map Review.**

- 1) It would be helpful to clarify what constitutes the size of a piece of land that needs NDOW review.**
- 2) This regulation seems to apply for rural lands and less to land being developed in urban areas like the Las Vegas Valley.**
- 3) The CGR needs a clear statement of exclusion from NDOW review (Tied to #1).**
- 4) Why in section 4 does NDOW have to review before any other organization? Seems logical that NDOW would do their review in parallel with other organizations, and be part of the final decision.**
- 5) The Statement of purpose need to be clarified to be clearer. Why are we doing this and how does it benefit wildlife of NV?**
- 6) Need clearer explanation of the corrective actions/powers that NDOW can take in this CGR.**
- 7) How long can NDOW take to do this review?**
- 8) Is there a relationship with existing environmental assessments that being done? How does NDOW collaborate with:**
  - a. Other environmental organizations?**
  - b. Other state agencies?**
  - c. Local planning commission?**

- 2) **The number of tags should be species dependent no combined so a turkey and deer tag count as 1 per species**
- 3) **This program should grandfather in existing youth and be applied to all new youth applying in 2023 and going forward.**

In southern Nevada common Chuckwalla numbers have greatly declined and we would recommend removing them from the list of lizard species that can be collected.**

8) **Commission Regulation 22-12 Amendment #1, Upland and Furbearer Seasons.**

**The Clark CABMW would like to recommends the following changes in future amendments:**

- 1) **The Wild Turkey 2023-2024 Spring –Limited Entry\_ Hunts 0131 and 0132 section, the Clark CABMW would like to see the 2024 hunts in the Moapa Valley be all move back 1 week (March 16-23; March 23-29 and March 30-April 5). This way the season begins on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday in March as it has for years.**
- 2) **Due to declining Sage Grouse numbers, the season limit should be set at 2 birds.**

9) **Commission General Regulation 508, NAC 502 Antler Point and Spike Elk Defined, LCB File No. R090-22.**
