Persons are invited to submit written comments to Committee Staff or attend and make comment during the meeting which will become part of the official record. **Persons wishing to comment virtually are invited to raise their hands in the Zoom virtual meeting forum during the appropriate time; each person offering public comment during this period will be limited to not more than three minutes.** All persons attending are asked to complete the sign-in sheet for attendance, whether speaking or not. To ensure the public has notice of all matters the Committee will consider, Committee members may choose not to respond to public comments to avoid deliberation on topics not listed for action on the agenda.

FORUM RESTRICTIONS AND ORDERLY BUSINESS: The viewpoint of a speaker will not be restricted, but reasonable restrictions may be imposed upon the time, place, and manner of speech. Irrelevant and unduly repetitious statements and personal attacks which antagonize or incite others are examples of public comment that may be reasonably limited.
