The Carson City CABMW reviewed and discussed this issue and engaged in significant discussion. It was pointed out that using dogs on bear hunts is proven to be responsible in that it allows more control on bears being harvested. It allows hunters to properly sex bears, determine whether a bear is lactating, and harvest older larger bears that are likely proven to be out of their reproduction years which has proven to allow impregnation by younger bears and improving recruitment. The CC CABMW Board members unanimously support the responsible use of hound in Bear hunting as we all feel that it is responsible and ethical harvesting that lends to proper and responsible management**

Other comments, including a dissenting viewpoint (different than the majority) or issue brought up during discussion: **These were submitted on January 26<sup>th</sup> 2021 via the electronic survey created by the Department. I will note that all recommended seasons were sustained and supported by the collective majority of the CC CABMW, but there was a dissenting vote on one of the hunts by one member of our CAB- Hunt 2161 Archery Antelope- The Chair received public comment from three different archery/bowman organizations here in Northern and Eastern Nevada voicing disdain of the Departments recommendation to decrease seasons in Unit group 042-042 and 043-046 to allow for additional opportunities to hunt antelope with muzzleloaders. They felt like using archery equipment as a primitive method of harvest is already difficult enough and that taking away a week of time is not supported by this community of hunters. They look at this as a huge takeaway.**
