- 1) **Agenda item: 17A, Commission Regulation 22-11, Big Game Quotas for the 2022-2023 Season**

The Committee received public comment and concern about the big game quota for Mule deer in hunt unit 192. At the request of the citizen, the Committee is requesting the 2022-2023 quota for archery, late, and muzzleloader Mule deer to be set at twenty (20) animals for archery, late, and ten (10) animals for muzzleloader. These two numbers are identical to the 2021-2022 quotas for hunt unit 192. The current recommendations to the Commissioners for the 2022-2023 season are fifteen (15) and seven (7).

Biologist Carl Lackey was present during the meeting. Mr. Lackey informed the Committee, that the current success rate in hunt unit 192 was 50% for the 2021-2022 season. Mr. Lackey said the potential loss of two more deer for each season would have an insignificant effect on herd population. The CCCABMW has previously asked the Commissioners a similar request with no results. We are asking the Commissioners to approve this request.

2) Agenda item: 17B, Commission Regulation 22-09, Amendment #1, 2022 Black Bear Quotas and Harvest Limits

The Committee received an informal presentation from Biologist Carl Lackey on the Black Bear population and hunt. During the “Q and A,” we discovered that there were 74 bear mortalities during the 2021-2022 season. This included fourteen bear (14) bears harvested, forty-six (46) death caused by vehicle impacts, four (4) through management and the remainder from natural mortality. The Committee supports the proposed Black bear quota for 2022-2023 hunt.
