DISCUSSION ON A PRESENTATION BY GREG HENDRICKS, DIRECTOR OF FIELD OPERATIONS FOR AMERICAN WILD HORSE CAMPAIGN (AWHC), ON THE PROJECT GOALS AND PLANS OF THE FISH SPRINGS WILDLIFE HABITAT DEVELOPMENT PROJECT.** This project will bring year-round wildlife water to areas in Douglas County that have seasonal limitations and significant wildlife use. **4a–4c. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING WHETHER THE DOUGLAS COUNTY ADVISORY BOARD SHOULD TAKE A POSITION ON:**

**4a. FOR POSSIBLE ACTION. DISCUSSION ON THE SECOND DRAFT FISCAL YEAR 2022 PREDATION MANAGEMENT PLAN.** The Commission will review the final draft of the Fiscal Year 2022 Draft Predation Management Plan with the Department. The Commission may take action to modify or endorse the plan. (*Wildlife Commission Agenda Item 9*)

**4b. FOR POSSIBLE ACTION. DISCUSSION ON THE POSSIBLE ADOPTION OF COMMISSION REGULATION 21-14, BIG GAME QUOTAS FOR THE 2021-2022 SEASON.** The Commission will establish regulations for the numbers of tags to be issued for mule deer, pronghorn antelope, elk, bighorn sheep, black bear, and mountain goats for the 2021 - 2022 seasons. (*Wildlife Commission Agenda Item 15A*)

**4c. FOR POSSIBLE ACTION. DISCUSSION ON THE POSSIBLE ADOPTION OF COMMISSION REGULATION 21-04, AMENDMENT #1, 2021 BLACK BEAR SEASONS.** The Commission will consider adopting the 2021 hunting season dates, open management units, hunting hours, special regulations, animal sex, legal requirements, hunt boundary restrictions, and dates and times for indoctrination courses for black bear. (*Wildlife Commission Agenda Item 15B*)

5. **FOR DISCUSSION ONLY.
