	Other comments, including a dissenting viewpoint (different than the majority) or issue brought up during discussion:
	1. Motion by Giovanni Giordano to accept the department's recommendation for all of the 2023-2024 mule deer hunts as proposed with the exception of hunt 1331 Resident Any Legal Weapon, unit group 035 to remain at the same quota as 2022, 30 tags. This request is made with consideration being given to the declining ALW success percentage in unit group 035 (2020-2021, 43%; 2021-2022, 39%; 2022-2023, 28%). Additionally, unit group 035 4-point or greater percent harvest has consistently lagged behind the statewide average over the last 3 years. It should be noted also that although we do not suspect that the low spring survey numbers are contributable to the harsh winter, it cannot be ruled out either. 2022-2023 spring survey was one of the lowest on record for unit group 035. Passed 4-0
